

"THE FOLLOWING SCHEDULE OF ALARM SIGNALS WILL GOVERN ALL UNITS AND SHIPS PRESENT."

<u>Alarm:</u>		<u>Whistle or Siren Signal:</u>	<u>Bugle Call:</u>
Air Raid	---	2 Short Blasts. (5 seconds each followed by 1 Long blast of 15 seconds) Silent for 10 seconds. Repeat.	-General Quarters
Gas Alarm	---	A prolong blast continued for 1 minute. Silent for 10 seconds. Repeat.	-Knock off Bright Work.
Call To Arms	---	Series of short blasts. (5 sec. each). Continued for 1 minute.	-To Arms.
Fire	---	1 long blast of 15 seconds followed by short blasts of 5 seconds each to indicate location. Silent 10 seconds. Repeat.	-Fire Call.
Secure from all Alarms.	---	3 long blasts of 15 seconds each.	-Secure.

NOTE: Gas alarm signal has been substituted for the old Blackout signal which is no longer required.

General Douglas MacArthur's forces continue to repel the enemy at Bataan peninsula. MacArthur's Men have knocked back every Japanese assault, inflicting heavy damages to the enemy.

General Douglas MacArthur proclaimed for 17 different offenses in Jap occupied territory, death is dealt out. Disobeying any Japanese order is death.

Dutch Fliers, flying American Made aircraft scored 12 Direct Hits on 8 vessels which included 4 Warships. The Dutch returned to their base without losing a plane. The attack was made between the islands of Celebes and Borneo.

The American Fliers in the Rangoon Area downed 20 Japanese Planes of the 60 that made an attack.

The British withdrew within 20 miles of Moulmein, Burma to strengthen their defense.

Portugal is sending some of her troops to protect their East Indies island possessions.

The enemy struck at Singapore this morning--one Japanese plane downed, and probably another.

The Dutch raided a Japanese airdrome in Kuching, capital of Sarawak.

The United States Government Reports that the invaders in the Atlantic Ocean will never return to their base. (Only information given).

General Rommel's forces struck 90 miles North-East and recaptured Agadabia.

In all air operations yesterday the British lost 2 planes.

Japanese invaders invaded 2 or 3 areas of Australian territory Friday night, north of Australia. This made the first attack in History made by an enemy. In Australia the Government has prepared for possible Japanese landings.
